

## Alcohol Policy Network Programs Mapped to the 2008 Ontario Public Health Standards

\* Notes: Although Alcohol has implications across the majority of the Program Standards, only the implicit program requirements regarding alcohol are included in the chart below. As many of the Alcohol Policy Network's services cross many program requirements, various services may be repeated for each program requirement. For the purpose of this document, the Alcohol Policy Network (APN) services include the services of the Association to Reduce Alcohol Promotion in Ontario (ARAPO). Both APN and ARAPO are programs of the Ontario Public Health Association (OPHA) and are funded through the Ontario Ministry of Health Promotion.
